November 2014 Summary of Activity

Assault

An officer took a report from a subject that was threatened on a job site. The report was delayed and the offender was no longer on site. The complainant declined to pursue the matter. Report only for documentation, no further action taken.

Criminal Damage to Property

While checking a vacant home, an officer observed broken windows and unsecured doors. The property management company for the residence was contacted to secure the home.

A church reported damage to their sign and outside lighting. The property was placed on an extra watch.

Two mailboxes were reported damaged.

DUI / No DL / Suspended / Revoked DL / Possession of Cannabis

DUI – 1 citation; No Valid Driver's License – 4 citations; Suspended/Revoked Driver's License – 1 citation.

Harassment

A resident reported receiving harassing text messages. Due to it being a juvenile matter, the school resource officer is working to solve the problem.

Domestic

Officers responded to one domestic during this reporting period. There were no signs of a battery. Domestic violence handbooks were issued. No further action taken.

Lockout

Officers responded to one vehicle lockout. Entry was gained.

Alarms

Officers responded to one burglar alarm with an unsecured door. The premise was checked for signs of burglary and key-holder was notified.

Premise Checks

One unsecured door was located while checking homes on house watch. Key holder was notified and the premise was secured.

Task Force Activity

The NIPAS Emergency Services Team was activated by Crystal Lake PD for a warrant service.

Suspicious Circumstance

A resident reported receiving suspicious calls from a subject stating he was with a computer virus protection service and wanted to gain access to her computer. The complainant did not provide access and ended the call.

Identity Theft

Two residents reported unauthorized use of their identity. These cases are being investigated by their banks. No further action taken.

Animal Incidents

A dog reportedly attacked the neighbor's alpaca while it was in the pasture.

Two injured deer were terminated.
