

**ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-8-2 OF THE VILLAGE CODE
REGARDING THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS ON THE EQUESTRIAN COMMISSION**

WHEREAS, On June 17th 2005 the Village of Barrington Hills (the "Village") through the President and Board of Trustees passed Ordinance 05-01, establishing the Equestrian Commission which is codified in the Village Code under Title 2, Chapter 8.

WHEREAS, The President and the Board of Trustees of the Village find and believe it to be in the best interest of the Village that Section 2-8-2 of the Village Code be amended to increase the number of members on the Equestrian Commission from three (3) members to five (5) members.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Kane, Lake and McHenry Counties, Illinois, as a home rule municipality, the following:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The Village Board hereby finds that the recitals contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are true and correct and does incorporate them into this Ordinance by this reference.

Section 2. Membership; Terms; Organization. Section 2-8-2 of the Village Code, shall be, and the same hereby is, deleted in its entirety and the following is inserted in lieu thereof:

"The Equestrian Commission shall consist of five (5) members, all of which shall be Village residents appointed by the Village President on the basis of their ability or experience, by and with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees and at least one (1) of which shall be a member of the Riding Club of Barrington Hills or such similar body existing at the time of appointment.

Members shall serve for a period of one (1) year beginning on May 1. Vacancies shall be filled by appointments, as provided in the previous paragraph for unexpired terms only.

The Village President, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, shall appoint a chairman from among the members to serve a term of one (1) year and until a successor shall be appointed and qualified."

Section 3. Validity. Should any part or provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part declared to be invalid.


Section 4. Superseder and Effective Date. All resolutions, motions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded; and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.
